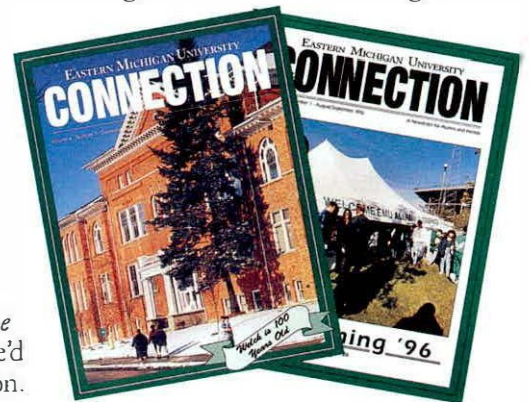
New Lines of Communication Open

THE GREAT LAKES ACADEMY, NEW CHARTER SCHOOL

AT ITS MARCH 18 meeting, the Board of Regents authorized the Great Lakes Academy in Pontiac as the University's fourth charter school.

The new charter school will be housed in a 13-classroom building and will be designed as an elementary school consisting of grades K-3. The academy will strive to provide an environment which promotes and provides practical knowledge to become productive and responsible citizens in the 21st century and will prepare students to function in a complex, ever-changing world by cultivating habits which promote a positive self-concept.

Academy officials expect to open the school Aug. 25, 1997,

and provide 183 days of instruction through June 12, 1998.

The Great Lakes Academy anticipates the enrollment of 192 students in grades K-3 for 1997-98, which would result in an administrative fee of \$34,560 to be paid to EMU. The academy expects to enroll 240 students in K-4 in 1998-99 and 288 students in grades K-5 in 1999-2000.

Charter schools are public schools of choice, which are legally independent and operate under contract to an authorized public body. Under Michigan legislation, they are created to develop benchmarks to improve all public schools through competition for students.

Other EMU charter schools include Gaudior Academy in Redford, Commonwealth Community Development Academy in Detroit and the Academy for Business and International Studies in Dearborn Heights.

Call for Comments - Accreditation

Eastern Michigan University is scheduled for a fall 1997 accreditation review by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). Federal regulations require that accrediting agencies allow for public comment on the qualifications of institutions or programs under consideration for initial or continuing accreditation.

Both NCATE and Eastern Michigan University recognize graduates, parents, schools and community organizations have valuable perspectives on the quality of the programs that prepare teachers and other school personnel. We invite interested parties to submit written testimony on the professional education preparation programs to:

Copies of all correspondence received will be sent to Eastern Michigan University for comment prior to the review. No anonymous or oral testimony will be considered.

Letters of comment should be received by September 15, 1997.

CONTINUING ED ON THE MOVE

CONTINUING EDUCATION Interim Dean Dennis Beagen announced a reorganization of Continuing Education in May, which will result in an increase in off-campus credit programming, the creation of new non-credit training opportunities, and the use of new technologies in the delivery of courses.

"Our primary goal is to build upon Continuing Education's already established foundation of successful programs," Beagen said. "The reorganization fully supports the mission of Extended Programs and will allow us to expand the geographic reach of credit and non-credit programs, develop and use new instructional technologies, provide students with innovative learning opportunities and build new partnerships with EMU faculty and administration."

In making the announcement, Beagen cited five goals for Continuing Education: create a new organization that is innovative, simplified and service-oriented; develop more external/extended programming; focus on credit and non-credit opportunities; create new interna-

tional programming by merging the Office of Academic Programs Abroad with the World College; and transfer the Elderwise Program to the College of Health and Human Services.

The organizational changes include the separation of Continuing Education into two branches: credit and non-credit.

"The new subdivisions will allow for the continued success of our credit programs while we begin pursuing and creating innovative non-credit opportunities," Beagen said.

The Office of Academic Programs Abroad will be transferred to the World College,

according to Dr. Donald Lopppow, interim assistant vice president for Extended Programs. This change is intended to facilitate the creation of new international programming. The merger will ensure all international programming is processed through one office, enhance and expand EMU's international focus and maximize resources.

The Continuing Education reorganization also will result in the transfer of Elderwise (Continuing Education's program for area senior citizens) to the College of Health and Human Services. The relocation will result in the establishment of an Elderwise liaison through the College of Health and Human Services' Gerontology Program.

Beagen said the creation and implementation of the reorganization plan was the result of several campus individuals and offices.

NEW COMPUTER SCIENCE DEGREE ANNOUNCED

BEGINNING NEXT FALL, EMU students will be able to work toward a master of science degree in computer science. The implementation of the degree was approved by the EMU Board of Regents at its March 18 meeting.

The new graduate program is designed to meet the industrial demand, both statewide and nationally, for qualified individuals with preparation in computer science. A special feature of the program will be the flexibility for part-time students with families and jobs.

Degree requirements can be fulfilled through one of three plans of study:

- practicum, for students who desire practical exposure to contemporary workplace problems,
- research study, for students who wish to do a significant extension of theoretical work or an in-depth study of a practical problem or
- thesis, for students who wish to do an in-depth study of a problem which is appropriate for thesis work and for those who plan further graduate work.

The master's degree program requires 33 hours of approved courses, which may include up to nine hours from upper division undergraduate courses.

It is anticipated that graduates of the program will fill a much-needed shortage of advanced computer programmers in technical fields and industry.

ORD SETS ALL-TIME RECORD

THE OFFICE OF RESEARCH Development (ORD) reported an all-time record of \$11.4 million in grants for the 1996-97 fiscal year.

Regent Action: ROOM AND BOARD INCREASE

Room and board rates at Michigan's state universities are going up, and so will EMU's. However, EMU's increase is among the lowest of any major institution.

Students living in residence halls will pay \$4,528 for the standard 20-meal, double occupancy room. That's an increase of \$128 from last year.

Single occupancy room and board rates will be \$5,786 for the 20-meal plan; \$5,734 for the 15- and 13-meal plans; \$5,678 for 10-meal plan and \$4,952 for the flex meal plan for residents in Hoyt and Hill halls. Rental rates at Pine Grove, Cornell Courts, Brown-Munson and Westview apartments will increase 2.9 percent.

The previous record was \$10.3 million, set in 1995-96. Last year, ORD helped faculty, staff and students attract \$10.1 million in awards and grants.

One of the main reasons for the record is a more aggressive faculty, according to Brian Anderson, ORD director. "Our faculty have become more experienced in that arena," said Anderson. He estimated that about 20 percent of EMU's faculty apply for grants.

Grants, which range in size from \$1,000 to \$500,000, are important in supporting the University's mission.

"By obtaining grants, we are advancing the mission of the University to enhance the learning experience of the students," Anderson said.

The money is used in a wide variety of areas, including theoretical and applied research, student learning, community outreach, public service and corporate learning.
