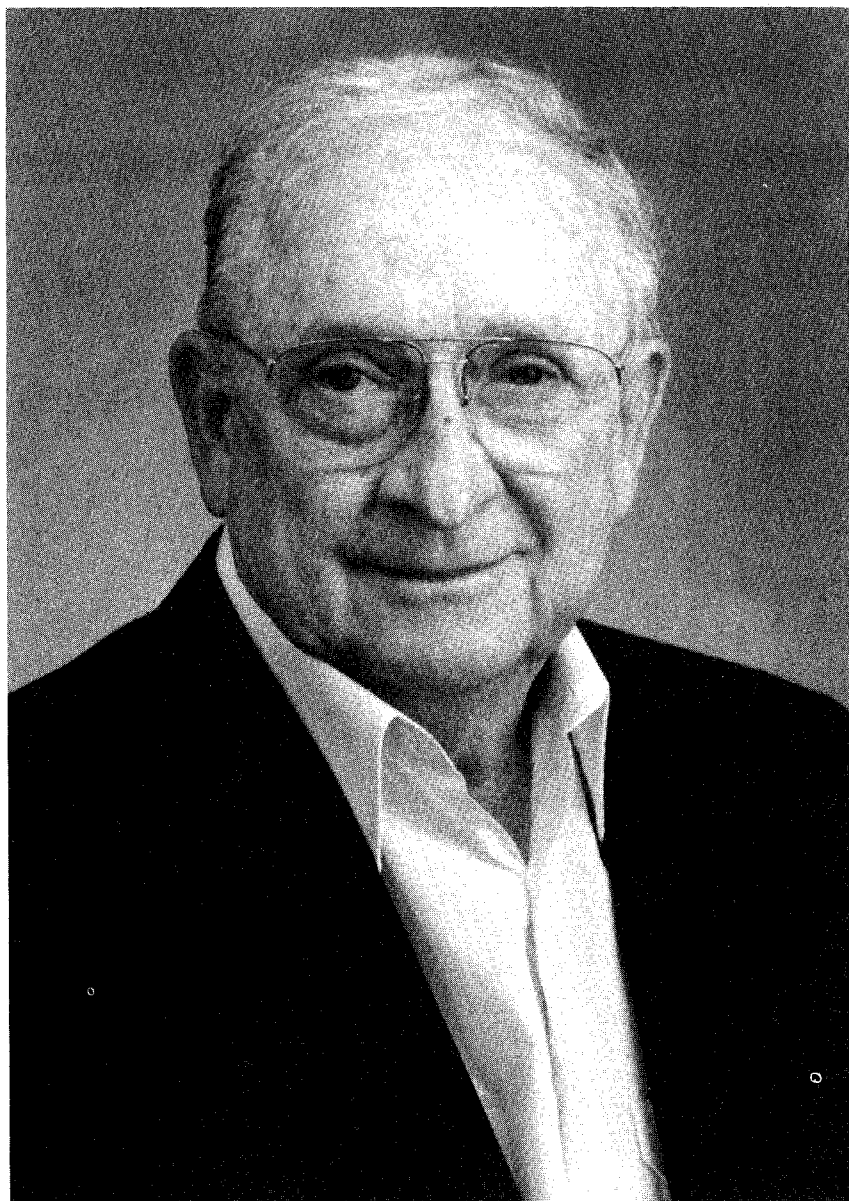
DEDICATION

On December 29, 1989, Thomas J. White, whose generosity made possible the establishment of the White Center and of this Journal, succumbed to cancer at his home in Chesterfield, Missouri. At the time of his death, he was 73 years old.

Tom White was a remarkable human being. He was blessed with a seemingly boundless supply of energy, and he was capable of great devotion to the persons and causes that were dear to him. His love for his wife, his children and his grandchildren was immense. His loyalty to the Catholic Church and to Catholic education was similarly great and was evidenced by countless contributions to Catholic causes. His patriotism was as ardent as it was practical; he deeply wanted his country to live up to its highest ideals. To that end, he established Centers at Notre Dame and at St. Louis University that had as their fundamental objective the schooling of law students in the basics of ethically sound policy analysis. Tom White was convinced that the legal profession could and should make a positive contribution to the achievement of national ideals, and he was convinced that Catholic law schools should play a leading role in that process.

The White Center is committed to the perpetuation of Tom White's ideals. We will continue to recruit law students who have shown an interest in law reform. We will continue to offer those students a program that sharpens their analytic skills and deepens their ethical awareness. And we will continue to facilitate their entry into public service careers. In this way, the Center will be a lasting memorial to the idealism of Tom White. We dedicate this double issue of the *Notre Dame Journal of Law, Ethics & Public Policy* to Tom White as a gesture of our affection for him and of our appreciation for the many contributions, both financial and personal, that he made to this Center and to the Law School during his long and productive life.
