### Abstract

### Biography

George Steininger was born in New York City on July 6, 1889, and died there on February 29, 1944. He received his A.B. degree from Hope College in 1916, graduated from New Brunswick Theological Seminary in 1919 and received his B.D. from Rutgers University in 1924. He received his S.T.M. from Union Theological Seminary in 1926. He was licensed by the RCA Classis of New York and ordained to the Christian ministry by the RCA Classis of Montgomery in 1919. He served the following RCA churches: Trinity, Amsterdam, New York, 1919-1922; Mott Haven, New York City 1922-1928; South Brooklyn, New York, 1928-1938; Kew Gardens, New York, 1938-1941. He served as a U.S. Army chaplain 1941-1943.

### Scope and Content

The collection contains papers written by Steininger, some dated at the time he was attending Union Theological Seminary, and sermons preached by Steininger from 1921-1928.
