## Author Prize by the EAPC in collaboration with Advances in Palliative Medicine

The European Association for Palliative Care (EAPC), in collaboration with "Advances in Palliative Medicine" (APM) wishes to announce a special once-off prize for the author of an original paper published (or accepted for publication) in "Advances in Palliative Medicine".

The prize will include free registration, accommodation and return economy flight to enable the winner to attend the 12<sup>th</sup> congress of the European Association for Palliative Care which will be held in Lisbon, Portugal on May 19–21, 2011.

The selection process and requirements to be fulfilled by the participants:

- The reward will be offered to the author (or lead author) of the published paper which in the opinion of the editorial board (Editor-in-Chief: Małgorzata Krajnik, Vice Editors: Zbigniew Zylicz, Ewa Jassem, Tony O'Brien, Katalin Hegedus) makes the greatest contribution to the specialty area of palliative care including symptom management, education, psychological, spiritual and ethical problems.
- 2. The competition is restricted to specialist colleagues working in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Russian Federation, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia and Ukraine.
- 3. All submitted articles will be peer reviewed. Manuscripts accepted for publication in "Advances in Palliative Medicine" must be original and must not have been published or submitted for publication in whole or in part elsewhere.
- 4. "Advances in Palliative Medicine" will be pleased to review original work on any aspect related to palliative care.
- 5. Papers with multiple authors will be accepted but the prize will only be offered to the lead author.
- 6. Original papers up to 2,500 words will be accepted.
- 7. The prize is not transferable and can only be applied for the purpose of attending the EAPC congress as described above.
- 8. Editorial Board members of "Advances in Palliative Medicine" are not eligible to participate in this competition.
- 9. The decision of the editorial board of "Advances in Palliative Medicine" is final and no correspondence will be entertained. The winner will be announced by 15<sup>th</sup> January 2011.
