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# **The Process**

The Project was started to assist the Library of Congress with it's own Veterans History Project of the American Folklife Center. With their limited resources, they are only able to digitize 11% of the interviews. In order to assist the Library of Congress with this arduous task, Clemson University students conduct interviews and collect other materials accepted by the project. They then facilitate their digitization for Clemson University records before sending the original materials to the Library of Congress.



Each student is required to complete the following before they may begin interviewing:

- Pass/Fail free response exam on the digital file nomenclature, preparation process, and interview courtesy
- Receive training on how to use the equipment purchased through the funding provided by the Creative Inquiry program
- Conduct a practice interview graded by a standard rubric where they behave exactly as if it was a real interview

## **Interview Process:**

The interviews are conducted at the veterans convenience. Many are conducted in the hospitality of their own homes. However some are conducted on campus to make use of heavier equipment such as green screens and projectors. It is the belief of the project and the Library of Congress that both veterans lives before and after military service are as important to preserve as the military service itself. All interviews are captured in high definition and often last over an hour.

## **Final Product:**

Each video is uploaded to YouTube and is then shipped in groups of 5-10. Each shipment contains a flash drive with every video and document in a digital format. Copies of the interviews are sent to the veterans as well.
