





We recommend that posters are printed on paper, as cloth does not sufficiently attach to the boards. The posters will be mounted on boards, tapes will be provided by ICPM. Each poster board is one-sided with two posters on the same side. The boards will be arranged in numerical order in the Auditorium hall, the numbers will be in the righthand side of poster boards. The poster sessions have a designated time in which the poster presenters are requested to set up (please see the online poster programme as well as the printed programme you will find in your congress bag), be available at their poster to discuss their research with the meeting attendees (please see the online programme at a glance as well as the printed programme you will find in your congress bag), and to tear down (please see the online poster programme as well as the printed programme you will find in your congress bag). Please remove your poster promptly during the scheduled removal times. ICPM will not be responsible for any posters left in the exhibit area after the scheduled removal times.
