


KEXT.

VVhereby a Committee is appointed for the faid County, forthwith to fieze upon all the Armes and Herfes, and imprifon the Perfons of all those that have appeared in, or given any affitance to that Infurrection, and Rebellion, or have willingly relieved any of the faid Rebels, with Armes, Ammunition, Money or otherwife.

ORDINANCE Of the LORDS & COMMONS Affembled In PARLIAMENT,

AS ST

Die Mercurii, 16 Augustii, 1643.

WW hereas divers fil=affected perfons of the County of Kent, yabe initatifully and Crayteroutip affembled themfelbes together, and in a Unarlike and bodile mamer, polletted themfelbes of divers Cobines and places in that Courtty, and habe Trayteroutly, and Rebelleoutly, Lebied Utlarre against the King and Partiament, and Robbed, Killed, and fooyled Divers of his Spaiefties Subjects; And notionthflanding, they were induced by an Diomance of both hontes of Partiament to tay before the alrines, and every man to bepart in Peace to all 2 their severall places of habitation, with an of= fer, not onely to passe by their offences then at= ready committed by them, but to give redreile to any just artebance that they though in a peaceable and Parliamentary way prefent to the Darliament, yet they wilfully and contemptu= oully refuled that favour offered unto them, and gave Battaile to thole forces fent by Au= thority of both Houses to suppress that Infur= rection, where, by Bods areat goodnelle they were wholly Routed, and a very great number taken Busoners; Bow to thend the like Tu= conveniences may be prevented bereafter; and that the Beace of the County may be the better. fetled. It is Didained by the Loids and Com= mong in this present Parliament allembled, That Sir Henry Vane fentoz, Sir John Sidley, Sit Anthony Welden, Sit Michaell Levefay. Sir Henry Heyman, SP. Nut, SP. Augustine Skinner, 99. Thomas Blunt, 99. Thomas Franklyn, Sir Edward Boyfe, D. Browne, Sir Wil-Jiam Springate, Sit Edward Mafter, 99. John Boyl. D. John Boyle, Sir Peter Wroth, 90. Richard Lee, Sir Tho. Walfingham, 99. Thomas Scyliard, and Sir John Robarts, 02 any three of them, thall forthwith seize upon all the Armes and Hogles, of all those that have in perfon appeared in that Infurrection and Re= bellion . And of all fuch as have willingly affi= sted or countenanced the same ; Dr that have mil=

(3)willingly relieved any of the laid Revelis, with Armes, Ammunition, Money, ozotherwile; D: that have refused to give their Assistance, (being thereunto required) to fuppelle the faid Infurrection of Rebellion; And that the 1902= fes that thall be to feized, thall be fent to the City of London, to the Committary for Borles there, to be Entred, and Lytted for the Service of the State, And that the Armes foto be fet= sed, chail be layd up in some place of safety in that County; Tothend, the same may be di= Uributed to the well affected Party of that County, when occasion requireth, And it is further Dedained by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid Sir Henry Vane fenior Sir John Sidley, Sir Anthony VVelden, Sir Michael Levelay, Sit Henry Heyman, 99. Nut, 99. Auguftine Skinner, 99. Thomas Blunt, 99. 1 homas Franklyn, Sir Edward Boyle, SP. B: owne, Sir William Springate, Sit Edward Matter, 99. John Boyle, S. John Boyle, Sit Peter Wroth, M. Richard Lee, Sit Thomas Walfingham, 99. Thomas Seyliard, and Sir John Robarts, or any three of them, thall have power, and are hereby Authozized to enter upon, and seize all and lingular the Lands, Tenements, and He= redicaments, Tthe Boods, Cattell, and Chat= tells, of all and lingular the persons that were Actors, Countenancers, or Abettors in the faid Rebellion, who did not submit to the said De-Dinance,

Dinance, and immediately come in , lay downe their Armes, and repaire to their places of ba= bitation, and to frize and Jimpzifon their perfons, Tothend, they be proceeded against according to the Law, and the merit of their offence; Brovided alwares, and it is fur= ther Ordemed by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid Sit Henry Vane Senior, Sir Iohn Sidley, Sit Anthony Welden, Sit Michael Levelay, Sie Henry Heyman, 99. Nur, 99. Augustine Skinner 99. Thomas Blunt, 99. Thomas Franklyn, Sit Edward Boyle, 99. Browne, Sir William Springate, Sir Edward Mafter, 99. John Boyfe, 99 John Boyfe, Sir Peter Wroth, 99. Richard Lee, Sir Thomas Walfingham, D. Thomas Seyliard, and Sir Iohn Robarts, or any three of them, thall have power, and are bereby authorifed to compound with such of the Persons aforesaid, as they thall thinke to be fit objects of fuch mercifull Dioceedings, and to receive of them such sums of Money by way of fine & Ranfome, as they or any three of them than thinke fit, habing re= spect to the offence, and the Effate of the ider= fon offending, and to certifie the names and fums received of every Perfon, and return the fame to the Guild-Hall, Condon, to the Trea= furers appointed to receive money and Plate upon the Dropolitions, and every Derfon that thall compound and day their money according to

to this Didinance, chall be freed in their plers fons and Chates, and Discharged from any further Profecution for the Crimes and of= fences committed by them in that Rebel= lion and Infurrection, and it is further Didet= ned that the faid Sir Henry Vane fenioz, Sir Iohn Sedley, Sir Anthony Welden, Sir Michael Levefay, Sit Henry Heyman, 99. Nut, 99. Augustine Skitner, 99. Thomas Blunt, 99. Thomas Franklyn, Sit Edward Boyle, D. Browne, Sit William springate; Sir Edward Master, 99. Iohn Boyfe, 99. John Boyfe, Sir Peter Wroth, B. Richard Lee, Sit Thomas Walfingham, B. Thomas Seyliard, 75. John Robarts, and ebe= ry of them thall be protected and faved harmes leffe by the Authority of both Houles of Pare liament, for what they thall doe in purfuance of this Didinance.
