Thereas the Lords and Commons in this present Parliament have made an Dzdmance for the speedy railing and leabying of money throughout the Kingdome of England and Dominion of Wales, for the reliefe of the Commons wealth, by taxing such as have not at all contributed or lent, or not according to their effates and abilities : And whereas the Allociate Counties of Effex, Suffolke, Norfolke, Cambridge, Jacof Ely, Herttord, and County of the City of Norwich, out of their good and ready affections have lately fent Forces with Armes Powder, 25 ullet, and 0% ther Amminition out of their leveral Counties, for the defence of the King, Parliament, and Kingdome, which they have paid with all the Officers belonging to the faid Forces, for two moneths, but having many charges lying upon them, cannot pay the faid Forces and

and Officers any longer without their great impoberilliment : The faid Loids and Commons doe therefore ordaine, that such summe and summes of money as are and thall be affeffed upon such perfon and persons as are of ability and have not contributed and lent, and have contributed and lent, yet not according to their abilities by bertue of the laid Ordinance in the laid respeatibe Counties, Mall be imploied to the the and for the maintaining of the faid Forces cent out of the laid Counties reweatively: And that all fuch fummes of mos nep to allefted and rated as aforefaid, as mail be received by the Collectors nominated for that purpole thall be paid by the faid Cok lectors to such Treasurers as mail be appointed by the Committees named in the laid Dydinance in their respective Counties, or any three or more of them, And that the laid Treasurers Mall dispose of the fame to the use aforesaid upon warrant directed to them under the hands of the Lieutenant o? Deputy Lieutenants of the faid respective Counties, or any two or more of them.
