THE STATE GAME LAW:

PLACES the title to wild birds and game in the State for the purpose of protection.

PROHIBITS killing, catching or taking, selling or buying shipping or transporting dead or alive, any game bird or its skin or plumage or game animal, except fixed seasons for killing, or except it be for experimental or propagation purposes, in which case the Game Commissioner will upon payment of \$1.00 and delivery of letters from two ornithologists, one of whom must be a resident of Florida, grant the applicant a permit to ship or transport not more than ten pair of any one species of Game or Bird.

NAMES the following as Game Birds: The Anatidae (swans, geese, brant, river and sea ducks); Rallidae (rall, coots, mud hens and gallinulas); Limicolae (shore birds, plovers, surf birds, snipe, woodcock, sandpipers, tattlers and curlews); Gallinae (wild turkeys, grouse, pheasants and quails), and turtle doves.

PROHIBITS the killing of any game birds, except between Nov. 20th and Feb. 20th, following when wild Turkey Gobblers, quails, turtle doves, swans, geese, brant, ducks, rails, coots, mudhens, sandpipers, curlews, snipe and plover may be killed with a gun, and **PROHIBITS** the killing of more than two turkey gobblers, or twenty quail, or 25 birds of other game bird species in one day and more than five turkey gobblers, or five hundred of any other game bird species during the season.

PROHIBITS the killing, catching or taking of the Doe, or Female Deer, or wild Turkey hen at all times; or more than one buck deer in one day or more than 3 Buck Deer in one season, viz.: Nov. 20th to Feb. 20th, following. No buck deer to be killed out of season.

PROHIBITS capturing, pursuing, injuring or killing fox squirrel, black squirrel or gray squirrel except on and from Nov. 20th to Feb 20th following, when they may be killed, except in public parks.

PROHIBITS hunting without a Hunter's License, which may be procured from the County Judge of the County in which hunting is desired.

PROHIBITS shipping or transporting any birds or game out of or within the State except in season and with Hunter's License. This applies also to transportation companies.

PROHIBITS trapping, snaring, dead-falls, or baiting and Night-Hunting.

PROHIBITS hunting, catching, or killing unmarked hogs without giving notice to three or more freeholders in the section.

There are Local Laws governing fishing in nearly all counties, and a Hunter's License shall not be construed as permission for fishing contrary to the Local Laws.

There is a State law against killing, wounding, selling or shipping the Robin except for scientific or educational purposes.
