“Rod” was one of the first male students of Bethune-Cookman College. This is his seventh year on the campus and these years have been crowned with success. He is the kind of go-getter that by sheer grit and fight is able to take a part in many school activities and then stand among the honor students in scholarship. In looking over his accomplishments there are few things that haven't come his way. Some of the outstanding things in his favor are: Winner of the J. T. Stocking medal, Varsity Wildcat, Member of Varsity Quartette, Winner of Prize in Essay Contest.”

These words taken verbatim from the 1930 yearbook are still characteristic of our beloved Edward Rudolph Rodriguez, Director of Student Welfare at Bethune-Cookman College. He has given to the members of the Bethune-Cookman College family the full benefit of his many talents for the major portion of his life.

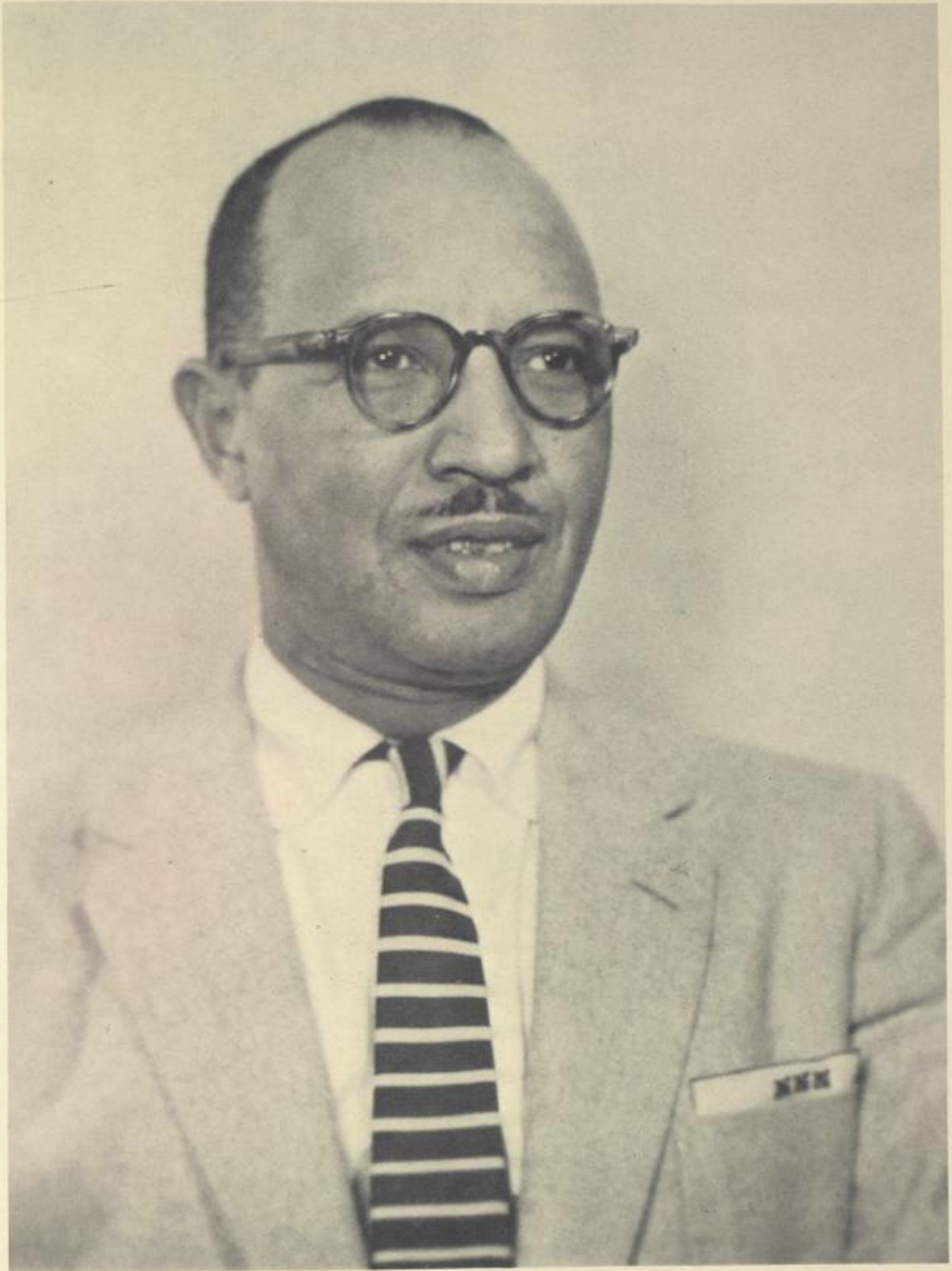
He received the A.B. Degree from Morehouse College; the M.A. Degree from Atlanta University and has further study on the doctorate at New York University.

Immediately upon graduation from college, “Mr. Rod” served as Executive Secretary of the Alumni Association of Bethune-Cookman College (1935). Since this time he has served as Director of N. Y. A. of the State of Florida for Negroes; Club Director for the American Red Cross in Europe and North Africa. He later returned to B-C.C. as Director of the Guidance Center and Liaison Officer for the Veterans Administration (1947). Presently “Mr. Rod” serves as the Director of the Mary McLeod Bethune Foundation and Director of Student Welfare.

Mr. Rodriguez was considered by our late Founder-President-Emeritus, Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune as her foster son. We the members of *The B-Cean* staff are proud to give this recognition to a most outstanding member of our family.

For the many extra hours he has spent for our cultural and educational development; For the outstanding example he has set as one who “Entered to learn and Departed to Serve”; For his strong devotion to “The Bethune-Cookman College Ideal,” we dedicate the 1964 edition of *The B-Cean*.

Faith Hall, erected in 1935 on the site of the original Faith Hall, the first building on the present campus, is the College dining hall.



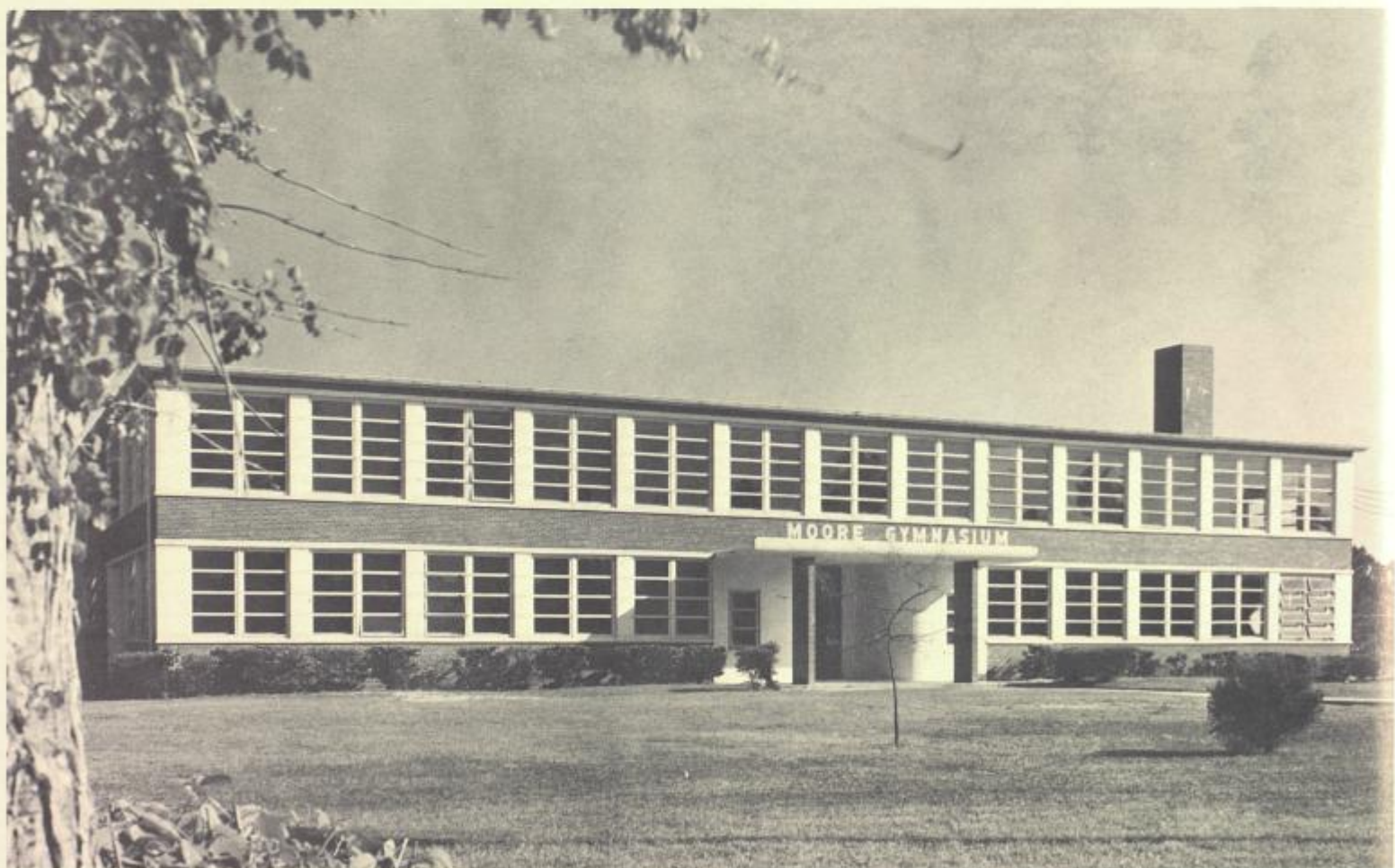
Cookman Hall, erected in 1924, was named after Cookman Institute. It is a boy's dormitory.

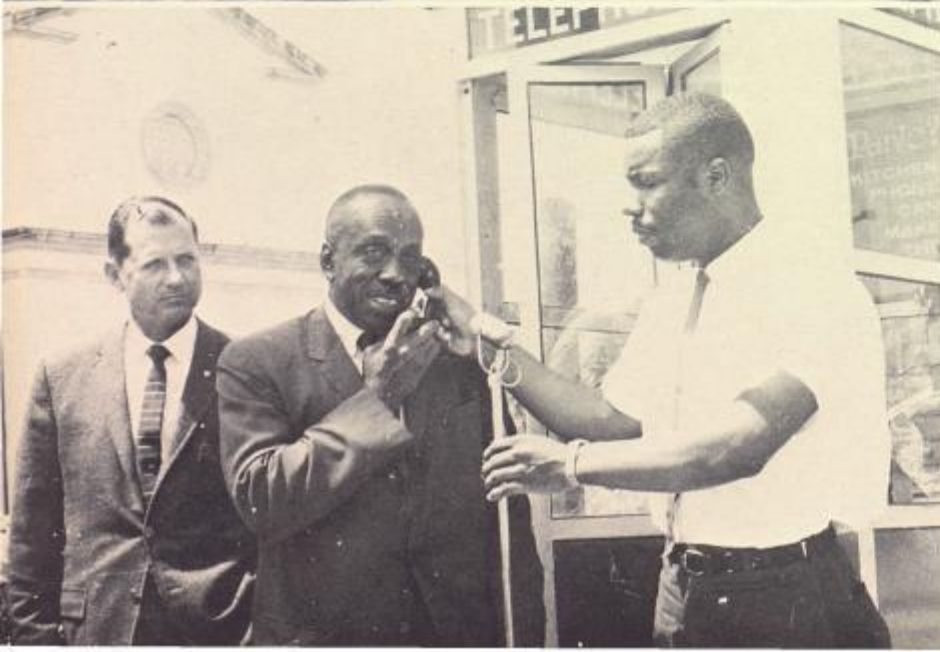

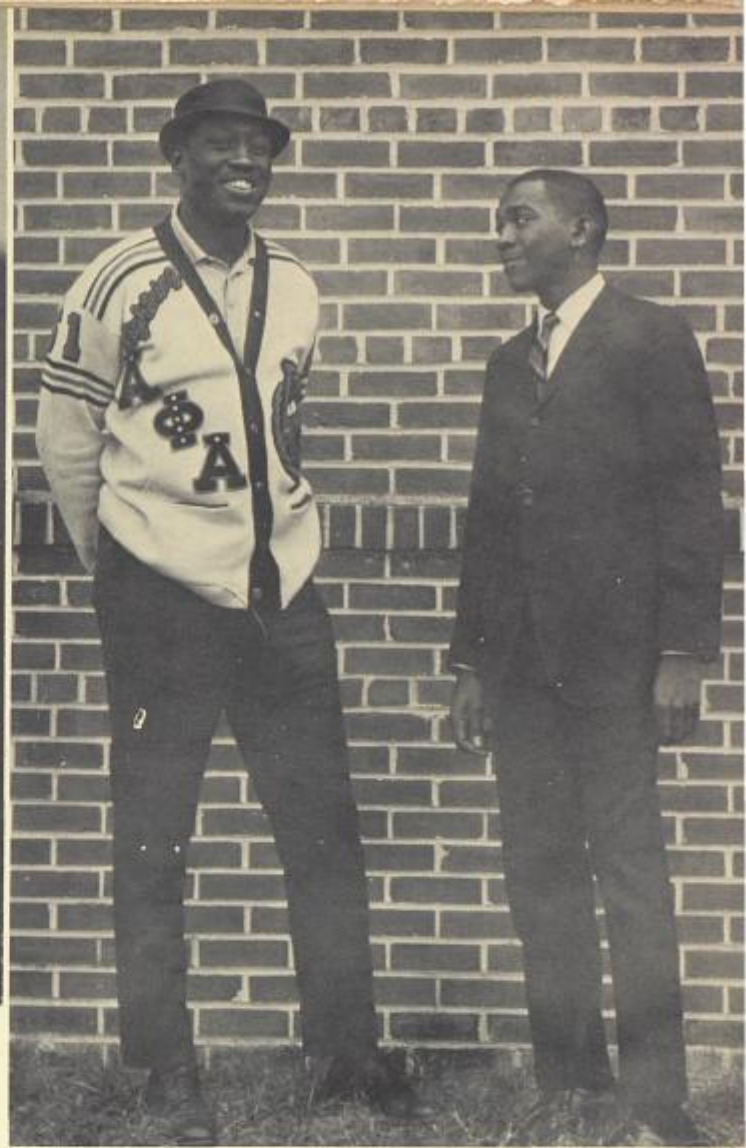

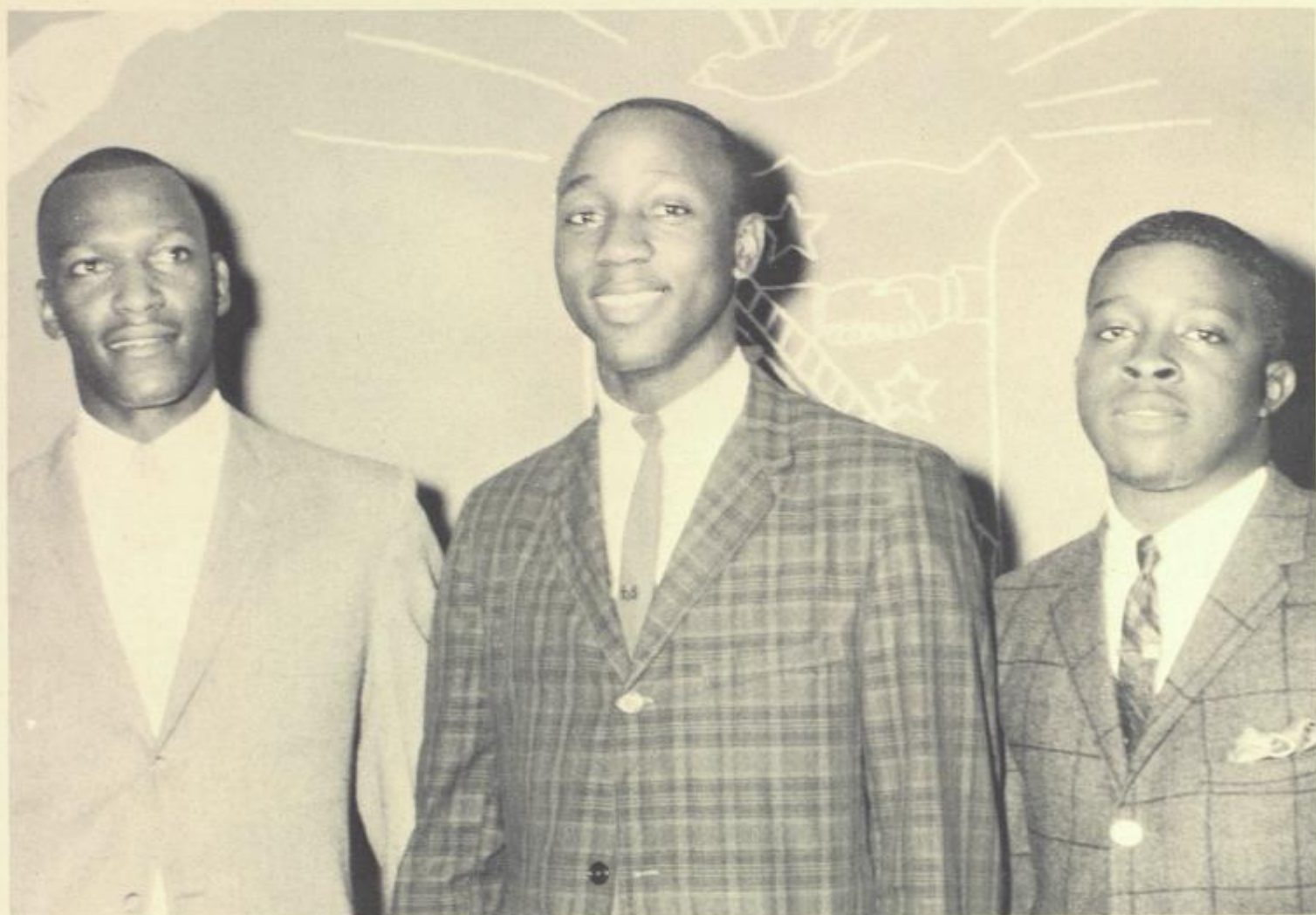
