





RESPONDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



TYPE OF ACADEMIC INSTITUTION



More bimodal distributions




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

BROAD TRENDS

- Structures and organizational hierarchies are in flux
- Three main shifts:
 - Grouping all tech services into single reporting unit
 - Splitting cataloging units into other library units, usually:
 - Electronic resources
 - Acquisitions
 - Collection Development
 - Special Collections/Archives
 - Digital Initiatives
 - Developing team models based on skill sets
- Shifting structures result of increased demand for eresources and digital collections
- Cataloging staffing shifts = Loss of positions outright or refocus of staff
- Increasing emphasis placed on non-faculty employees
- Heavy reliance on outsourcing



Student Centered Technical Services

An extensive body of literature is available on the topic of student employment and training in academic libraries. Some of this literature focuses directly on training students in technical services, and places a strong emphasis on training students for copy cataloging work. Many libraries have already used students very successfully to assist with cataloging workflows, and have taken advantage of students' knowledge of foreign languages.

When projecting the evolution of technical services, I feel that economic and budgetary pressures will drive the emergence of what I refer to as the "student centered technical services" model. The traditional technical services functions, those taught to LIS schools graduates, include acquisitions, cataloging, serials control, electronic resource management, database maintenance, and bindery/labelling/repair. Many academic libraries already have students assisting with some of these processes, but much of the work is handled by full-time staff (professional and/or paraprofessional). 
