Danielle Skeehan is an Assistant Professor in the English Department at Oberlin College where she specializes in early and nineteenth-century American literature. Her work has appeared in journals such as *The Eighteenth Century: Theory and Interpretation, The Appendix, The Journal of the Early Republic, Commonplace,* and *Early American Studies.* Her first book, *The Fabric of Empire: Material and Literary Cultures of the Global Atlantic, 1650-1850,* will be published by Johns Hopkins University Press in fall 2020.

Ho is the author of several articles and a forthcoming book on the photography and filmmaking of American missionaries in twentieth century China.
