The specifications for poultry house are not yet prepared, and it is not possible to give a complete bill of lumber at this time.

The original estimates called for the following:

- 37,000 feet native red pine lumber, mostly 1 inch boards;
- 9,000 feet native rustic, ceiling and finish;
- 1,300 " V.G. Oregon fir flooring;
- 100,000 Extra Star A cedar shingles.

In the first item is included a good deal of 2 x 4 stuff; some 2 x 6, 2 x 10, 4 x 6, 8 x 8, etc. In the new specifications that are being prepared the above amounts will be cut down about one-seventh.

There will also be needed about 450 cedar posts 8 feet long.
