Dear friend,

I am informed that your teacher of modern languages has resigned and the Mr. Arnold is one of the applicants for the position. Mr. Arnold came to the University last year to conduct the classes in modern languages during the absence of Mr. Arnoldson, the regular occupant of the position. I took a year of class work under Mr. Arnoldson, who is regarded here, so far as I know, as a good teacher. I have done about the same amount of work under Mr. Arnold. The latter work was in both German and French. So far as I am able to judge, Mr. Arnold has the qualities of an excellent teacher in those subjects. I have made some inquiries among the students, and my opinion seems to be general *among them.*

One of my reasons for writing this is of course my friendship for Mr. Arnold; the other and perhaps more important reason is the possibility that you might be subjected to the ordeal which the University has had since the death of Professor Mathews to secure a man who could be tolerated in these subjects.
