## New Library Catalog Coming!

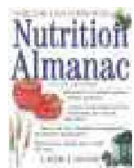

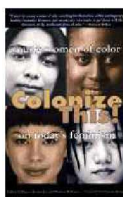

## RefWorks

This semester, more and more students, faculty, and staff have been discovering a wonderful resource called RefWorks.

This software allows users to build personal, individual databases for managing citations and creating bibliographies in whatever publication style is desired (MLA, APA, etc.) helping students cite properly and manage information efficiently.

It also helps students manage electronic resources such as web pages and articles accessed through databases. Anyone wishing to learn how to use RefWorks should contact the Reference Desk at 465- 6502 to set up an appointment.

The cooperation between libraries and the technology which automates the location and transmission of materials makes the interlibrary loan process effective and earns me more credit than I deserve."

Last year the ILL Department (Beatrice and one other part-time student) processed 5,685 borrowing and lending requests.

"I'm not a professionally trained librarian but I think my educational background, my curiosity and my diverse interests have helped me to make a contribution."




