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The New Decade of Scholarly Publishing

As we move into a new decade, the landscape of scholarly publishing is ever-improving. The latest Scientific, Technical and Medical Publishers (STM) report suggests, “virtually all STM journals are now available online, and consequently, the vast majority of journal use takes place electronically.”¹ While electronic publishing is not new, in recent years, changing publishing norms and expectations have made gold open access journals the future of academic and scientific publishing². The significant change in open access scholarly publishing likely stems directly from Plan S³, an initiative that arose from an international group of research funders (Coalition S). Coalition S requires that beginning in 2021 scientific publications that result from research funded by public grants must be published in compliant open access journals or platforms³. This requirement will shift the pattern of submissions and consequently the competitive landscape among journals for readership, impact factors, and institutional subscriptions.

This evolving landscape of online open access offers great benefits to authors and readers, as open access publications are available nearly immediately⁴. In line with these benefits, the *Marshall Journal of Medicine* remains an online open access journal, publishing articles to expand the knowledge of rural health care for practitioners, educators, researchers, and policymakers around the globe. In accordance, the *Marshall Journal of Medicine* is indexed in Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ)⁵.
