
Seto City archaeologist Kimichika Kawai holding a Muromachi Period (c.1336-1573) kiln support (焼台) at the Konagaso kiln site.



Pottery sherds ubiquitous underfoot.



Ceramic sherds incorporated into mosaics on bridges around Seto.



Kiln furniture (supports, sagars & shelves) incorporated into revetments around Seto, especially on the 'The Path of the Kiln Fence' (窯垣の小径).



Idiosyncratic re-use of ceramic products. Roof tiles used to line culverts/ drainage channels. Biscuit fired teapots delineating plots on an allotment.



Dilapidated, yet still occupied, building in the centre of Seto.

Setomonogatari 2 – Rice (2015), red clay, ceramic decals, mixed media




