

Steve Feltmann, Lacrosse (Long Valley, NJ)

- * Four-year letterwinner and starter for three and a half years at goalie. Team captain as a senior.
- * 2003 Stats: Currently 15-2 with a 5.92 goals against average and a 67.6 save percentage.
- * 2003 Awards: Post-season honors haven't been announced yet.
- * Other Career Honors/Stats: 2002: Second Team All-American, ECAC Upstate NY Player of the Year, SUNYAC Player of the Year. Recorded a 5.72 goals against average and a 68.6 save percentage. 2001: Honorable mention All-SUNYAC. Had a 7.66 GAA and a 61.8 save percentage. 2000: Second team All-SUNYAC. Had an 8.28 GAA and a 61.7 save percentage. Career record of 43-12 (through April 22).
- * Team is currently 15-2 and is ranked fourth nationally in Div. III. Team won a school-record 16 games and tied for fifth in the NCAA playoffs in 2002. Cory Haggerty, Baseball (Ilion, NY)

- * 2003 Stats: Currently batting .309 with four homers, six doubles and 28 RBI in 39 games. Leads team with 117 assists and 17 walks and second on team with nine stolen bases.

- * Other Career Honors/Stats: 2002: Second Team All-Region, First Team All-ECAC Upstate NY, First Team All-SUNYAC, NCAA Div.
