I Lave got fine hound from De Brydger a good and excellent Clengyman a friend of more, and the subscription towards the trinting tress goes on well.

I can with thath afsure you that I shall always book buch with pleasure to the day I spent in your society at Mheese Castle and stall note. It down amongst the happy days of my life, I can only regret. The grappication is not to be repeated. How good and hind you are in the mulst of so much business and ourpation to write to me. Lord william is much flatteved by your thend manner of mentioning him. he only regrets he could not have given more, he is down, all in her fromen to get subsemptions, but I am darry to day has not been very successful, I wish every body could

have heard you pleading for your people, and relating your most interesting stony, they would not then have refused to affish so good and touslable an undertaking. I must not take up your precious time by writing a longer letter therefore my esteemed and greatly nespected freeze let me biel you action and I carrestly entreatyour fragles. and that god in this goodself. may grant you a safe voyage and a huppy meeting with your wife your Family and your Teofele is the fearen Trager of your Very grateful & kumble her The hyllomerrel
