I Muy student of the college or miniber of the faculty may become a number of this elub, by conforming to its constitution and less-laws, See I. all officers, Election, and Duties, See I. all officers in this club shall be held by students of the agricultural department. Sec. II. The officers shall consist of a President, Dice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Sergeant -al-arms. Sie III. These officers shall be elected mmedialely after the adaption of the Constitution. Sec IV. All permanent officers shall be elected by ballot, the vote of the majority present being necessary to elect. See V. The term of office shall expere at the end of each school term. See II. all officers thus elected shall hold their respective offices until the next give. eral election.

See VII. The candidates for office shall not exceed three, Sec VIII. It shall be the dristy of the President to preside at all meetings of the Club, to enforce due observance of the Constitution and By Laws, to unhose fines and appoint committees, unless otherwise frouded for; to call special meetings, to fill all timporary vacancies that may occur in office and performe all other duties of his office not herein specified, in sec. 1 Sec. IK. It shall be the duity of the Vice President to assest in anything necessary, and preside in the absence of the President. See X. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a correct record of all proceedings of the Club; to read the previous meetings! eall the roll; amounce aft nonperform ances, performe all duties of his office not herein specified and on retiring from office, he shall deliver to his successors all documents pertaining to the office. It shall be the duty, of the Treasurer to collect all fines and fees and forjout the same at the request of the magouty of men bers present and to make a report of the financial condition of the Club on his vacating the office or at any other time when

the majority of the members present duni it necessary. Article II. Time and Place of Meeting See I. The Clock shall meet every alter. nate Tuesday the place of meeting and the hour, to be specified by the presiding offices at each meeting unless otherwise provided article V. Amendaments. See I. any article or section of this constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the Club, by a two-thirds rate of the members of the Club, provided, the frafased amendment shall have been read before the Chub at the previous meeting.
