There is a department of Domestic Science in our State University maintained as other departments are maintained. The Kansas City Manual Training School has the most complete work of this kind in Missouri. A few of the high schools in the smaller towns do a little work of that kind. St. Louis provides for instruction for the girls in the 7th and 8th grades. Except at the University local districts pay all the expenses. The Normal Schools have departments of Agriculture and expect to provide, this year, departments of Domestic Science. This is conditioned upon the appropriations made by the present General Assembly.
