### Officer Involved Shooting Leaves Unanswered Questions

The latest officer-involved shooting in a city that has seen many this year has left a neighborhood concerned and a city official asking questions in San Bernardino.

Terrell Markham, 16, was shot by an unidentified police officer on Nov. 17, after he had allegedly pointed a handgun at the officer, according to a statement issued by the police department.

The name of the officer who shot Markham has not been released. The press release from the department states only that the officer involved was male.

The incident began when a uniformed officer went to a liquor store in San Bernardino to contact a subject who fled into the common area of a housing project. As the officer gave verbal orders to Markham, the teenager allegedly pulled out a gun and pointed at the officer who then shot him several times with his handgun. Medical assistance was called and sent to the scene to take Markham to a nearby hospital. According to the police, a

But Ruby Sims, Markham's grandmother contested the department's version of events. She told the Black Voice News that the family was in shock over the shooting.

"He was at my house. He walked out of the

house going to the store. He didn't have anything on him," Sims said.

She questioned the department's stance that he had a gun and said that she thinks it was planted. She also said the police had kicked him unconscious, handcuffed him and

"He was shot in the back. One bullet went through the head and shot out his left eye," Sims said, "He was shot in the back and on

Markham's medical condition is unknown. Sims said that the family was not allowed to

The shooting has concerned many city residents and at least one local elected official who attended a community rally after it hap-

Councilman Rikke Van Johnson said that he was especially concerned about the high number of shootings committed by the city's police officers. Already, in 2007, there have

San Bernardino is being countered by a city and community mobilization program that was implemented earlier this year by the city. According to a recent edition of the Congressional Quarterly

been 11 officer-involved shootings with seven of them being fatal.

The police department employs about 200 police officers to service a city of about 200,000. The shooting rate appears to be increasing even as the violent crime rate in Bernardino ranked as the 42nd most dangerous city in the country, but that's a big improvement from the two previous years where it checked in among the top 20 most dangerous cities, according to the statistics from those years.

Van Johnson said he plans to look into the troubling issue as much as he can and any direction he can go "as to why we have a culture that can just go out and shoot".

He added that he did not know if other elected officials who shared the dais with him felt the same concerns or views on the rash of officer-involved shootings this year because this issue is closer to home for him. Most of those shot have been African-Americans including many from the area he represents in San Bernardino.

"Even police shootings of people with no guns, they call it justifiable," Van Johnson said. He added that he was not sure whether a situation would arise where it would be

### Sisters Cook Turkey and Stuffing for Families Caught in Housing Crisis

Sisters Ruby Ellison and Annie Powell shy away from the media glare that comes with something they believe in: giving back.

"When you give, you always get something back," Ellison said "We grew up poor because Mama raised nine children. We've been blessed."

Visiting relatives in Rialto recently the sisters recalled the day their grandchildren asked them to do something nice for children at the Decatur, Alabama Boys and Girls

"My two grandsons came home and said "Grandmamma we need your help,' Powell remembers. "I said, what do you want grandma to do?' They said, 'We need you to cook something real special for the children at the Boys and Girls Club. I figured they wanted me to bake cookies or a cake.

Turns out says Powell the children wanted a turkey dinner complete with trimmings. They wanted to make sure those children had a good hot Thanksgiving dinner.

"I got on the phone and called Ruby," says Powell. I told her, 'The kids are on their way over, 'They're going to drop a bomb on you."

"We both laughed then we called

club officials and asked how many children would be attending the dinner. When the official said 125 - we gasped," said Powell.

Ellison told Powell - "We can do it." It took four turkeys and five pans of dressing to feed the crowd. That was Thanksgiving 1998. Since then the sisters have served up more than 2,800 hot turkey and

stuffing dinners to children and their families.

Not much has changed since that faithful first turkey fest. "We've got it down to a science now," says Ellison. "We are bargain shoppers." The sisters buy all of the food. The cooking starts the night before Thanksgiving.

Loveridge will become NLC president in 2010. San Diego Council Member Jim Madaffer, president of the League of California Cities,



### **Healthcare Workforce Should Reflect Diversity**

According to a study conducted by the University of California at San Francisco's Center for the Health Professions we have a shortage in all categories in our workforce of healthcare workers period. The problem is a dire shortage in inner cities and rural areas of the state. This is a double whammy for Blacks, Hispanics and the poor of California. The California Wellness Foundation is seeking solutions to this dilemma but in my opinion is not putting their wealth of financial resources into funding agencies nor organizations that can help bring relief to this problem. Now in defense of the foundation, they are contracting with the Young



Communication Group to do some outreach through the Black Media to the tune of just over \$75,000 for the entire state. None of the other foundations, like Kaiser Permanente, Catholic Healthcare West, Sutter Health California Endowment who

say they are concerned about the topic are doing that with the Black community. They are, however, spending money with each other to talk about us and our problems. In one of the Wellness funded reports, it points out that 51 of our 58 counties are impacted with a shortage of at least one understaffed healthcare profession. And to bring it closer to us in the Inland Empire, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, are on that list. And, you have known for years that we have the lowest college going rate in the state, so it's no surprise that we're on the list. Now we also know from demographic reports that we are the fastest growing counties in the state for the Black population with our need being the greatest for more healthcare workers. With this challenge we should have a greater interest and need to start developing a strategy to have a healthcare workforce that reflects the diversity of those who will need it.

One of the identified solutions is to recruit a workforce from the communities in the greatest need. The report states that people have a tendency to return, if the opportunity presents itself, to their own community if the pay, environment, facilities, housing, and continuing education are offered as in other communities. The University of California system has recognized that some way must be found to increase our enrollment into the existing schools of medicine, pharmacy and nursing. A way must also be found to increase Black student access to the proper science and math curriculum in our public schools. In another report released by UCLA this past week on the achievement gap of Blacks in California; they point out that Black students do not have access to the courses required for college in science or math. According to the California Basic Education Data System "African American students are less likely than their white and Asian counterparts to have access to college preparatory courses". They also found that even when they do have the curriculum the teachers are not qualified to teach them. They found this to be true in 107 of the high schools of which one half of the states Black students attend. On October 28th 2007 Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed into law AB428 authored by Wilmer Amina Carter of Rialto which require the districts to notify the students and parents on the status of their A-G requirement courses. These are the courses student take in preparation for our college system. Without these courses they cannot enter any of California's public universities of which Blacks pay taxes to keep open. Students from other countries have full access, but pay no taxes. Now all of the blame cannot be placed at the door of the policy makers, we too must become more aggressive and engaged with the system and increase the educational attainment of our young people. I know it is difficult with all of the things going against us including the Ward Connerly's of the world who want to remove all requirements for entrance that is racially motivated. The UCLA report clearly documents that race is a factor when it comes to Blacks, Hispanics and Native American Indians in California.

When you add to all of this the other component of healthcare coverage you can see our community is being treated like a third world country.

We must ask our local school boards to establish health care career magnet schools starting in kindergarten straight through graduation. The Dr. Howard Inghram Elementary School in San Bernardino was re-opened as such but has been discontinued. They even had a partnership with the program Community Hospital located across the street. The United Nurses Association of California even adopted the school as a project. During one of their open school sessions the student dressed as physicians and other allied health care workers which they learned about at the hospital. They had healthy food snacks which they learned from the dieticians at the hospitals. Now rumors float that the hospital will close and the health care careers have been replaced by an environmental focus, that is also important, but the district has some already. This school is located in the heart of the Black and Latino community. Now I do not have to tell any of you the salaries healthcare workers make. It is not below the poverty

level. I am saying to the Secretary of Education, State Superintendent of Education, California School Board of Education, local School Boards of Education, Book Manufacturers of California, Governor of California, Senate and Assembly of California, Health Care providers of California, Health Care Insurers of California, Hospitals in California, Educational Institutional of higher learning in California, parents and students in California, we have a problem that exists today but can be resolved if we tackle it with determination. It will not be solved by going out of the country and bringing in workers; you have done this in the past and it created language and cultural issues in the workforce and with patients.


We cannot point fingers but must place them around the plow and start plowing. Now after a Black, Latino or Native American Indian parent reads these reports you might ask yourself these questions: If I motivate my child to the point of seeking a career in the healthcare field, will the proper science and math classes be there? Will qualified teachers teach them? Will the university admit them? Will the major employers hire them? If they go into business of their own will the financial institutions give them a loan to start the business? Will there be office space in the neighborhood where the patients live? Will they be able to get insurance for the business? Even though you might have these questions you will still need to motivate your child.

### **Thanksgiving Soul**

When a meal is especially enjoyable, diners will often comment that the chef put his foot into a meal. It is a way of saying that in addition to the herbs and spices, the chef added a bit of his soul.

Thanksgiving dinner is like that for me. I have been preparing the holiday meal for 13 years. It is a lot of work, but I truly enjoy it. The preparation becomes a kind of meditation for me. I attain a transcendental state wherein I become one with the food; each ingredient is a part of me that I add with unselfish, loving care. There is nothing more gratifying than to see my family and guests content and full following my meal - it is a sign that they have tasted my soul and found it to their lik-

Thanksgiving is truly a time to share your soul, to put your foot into life as it were. Of course this entails more than preparing a moist turkey, which is why so many Americans take this opportunity to donate time or food to the homeless and others visit the elderly or hold hands in pediatric wards of hospitals. All such gestures are noble and important approaches to sharing our blessings. But just as our souls are ever

expanding so too should our generosity extend beyond this week.

I was recently asked what we could all do to advance the values of faith and family. Quite a question for a journeyman actor, but I am game. Beyond exercising responsible sexual behavior in order to insure that one does not become part of the problem of single parenthood, there is no other way but to demonstrate the importance of these values through living them. Preaching is great, but the folks that are really

influencing lives and attitudes are the ones that roll up their sleeves and get their hands dirty.

In addition to the methods of sharing mentioned above, I am partial to the Big Brothers Big Sisters organization. As important as it is to feed the physical hunger of the homeless, it is also important to fill the emotional and intellectual emptiness of children. It is possible to do that spending as little as one hour a week.

According to information on the organization's website, a study demonstrated that boys and girls that participated in the program for 18 months were 46% less likely to use illegal drugs, 27% less likely to use alcohol, 52% less likely to skip school, 37% less likely to skip class and had better relationships with family and peers. Minority children fared especially well with 70% of minority kids less likely to initiate drug use. In short, participation in Big Brothers/ Big Sisters increased the chances of so many children to have success later in life.

I recall my introduction to the Big Brothers of Greater Los Angeles. During my orientation, I sat in a room of perhaps 15 men all interested in being partnered with a little brother. As I looked around, I noticed that I was the only Black man in the room. After being finger printed and sitting through an initial interview with a social worker, I thumbed through a book of applications and photographs two inches thick of boys, most of whom were Black, waiting for big brothers.

There is nothing scientific involved in this observation, it is purely anecdotal. Nor is this meant to be an indictment of Black men - just a call to arms. From what I am told by representatives of the organizations, my experience was normal. There are children wait-

As we celebrate our blessings this holiday season, let's think about ways in which we can share a bit of our knowledge, a bit of our wisdom, a bit of our love and a very little bit of our time. Let's give some thought to putting our feet in the true spirit of Thanksgiving.

### **Governor Attacks Nurses - Again**

While some Nurses might be busy worrying about gas prices, the home mortgage debacle, our VP hunting with friends who hang the confederate flag in their place of business and other things, I write to say that something more earthshaking and earthshattering is happening in the state of California. That something is the Govenor's health care reform bill, more formally known as the "Health Care Security and Cost Reduction Act."

I noticed that not much news coverage is being given to this comprehensive and complex bill lately except maybe half minute news bites on several major networks. I am a Registered Nurse Practitioner, and as part of my new position as Policy Analyst for the African American Health Institute, of San Bernardino County, I sat down to read the full text of the Govenor's reform packet and was in for a bombshell. On page number 12 and 24 (of this 163 page document), The Governor has literally

California's Nurse Practitioners! He is proposing to shatter our very existence!

Allow me to quote, in part, what the Governor has in this bill... "The bill would create the Task Force on Nurse Practitioner Scope of Practice that would consist of specified members appointed by the Governor, the Speaker of the Assembly and the Senate Committee on Rules. The bill will make the task force responsible for developing a recommended scope of practice for nurse practitioners and would require the task force to report the recommended scope of practice to the Govenor and the Legislature on or before June 30, 2009. The bill would require the Director of Consumer Affairs, on or before July 1, 2010 to promulgate regulations that adopt the recommended scope of practice." ... (page12) Furthermore on page twenty four (Section 6, 2838 a 1-4e) of the bill the Governor goes on to state "The Task

force is hereby created " and he lists, in detail, who will be members of the committee and gives them a timeline (2009) to accomplish their work.

HELLO!

Would everyone out there who knows and have recieved care and treatment from a Nurse Practitioner, raise your hand? 



### **Racism Facing Ambitious Black Students**

Two categories of problems future Black leaders will face in the USA marketplace pertain to their careers and to racism. Inside the Career category is deciding on a goal; figuring out ways to get from where they are, to where they want to go; and obtaining the education, training, and experience needed to do what has to be done in discovering their talent, developing their talent, and finding a niche for the best display of their talent. Each is quite involved as, for example, in

taking the appropriate courses and making high grades; acquiring enough money; handling family responsibilities and problems; leaving behind family, friends and peers; and deciding on a predominantly Black or predominantly White institution. Some counselors are useful but none are completely adequate. Some counselors will fail to know your requirements; will be misleading; and/or are disinterested. Besides, none will really know who you are or your motivation. Hence, much will be left to the student to figure out and then work out-and the best results come from starting right now!

Racism is divided into what will be done to the Black student and how the Black student will react. The System of Values you will face depends on the college (or post-graduate or high school) attended-and they are quite different in

White as opposed to Black institutions. Your choice will determine your future lifestyle-either Eurocentric or Afrocentricand perhaps your mate. In general, the USA places more importance on top White institutions and that opens door to getting better jobs, increases the chances of promotions, and enhances publishing papers. While at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, I was able to get papers published in top journals that may not have been published had I been in lesser ranked institutions. But what is done to Black students at White institutions can be shocking-at least it was for me. I left an all-Black "We" community where people cared about each other to enter the University of Michigan where no body cared about me. This forced me to become both an individualist and isolated. White students were familiar with things I

had never heard of-and there were many such things. Even "White" English was strange. Apart from no one caring and no one helping, there were those who deliberately fashioned situations for me of losses, lacks, and obstructions.

For "Ambitious" Blacks facing similar situations, the question is: "How will you react?" Will you take a defeatist attitude or even "give up?" What will you do when you fall and hurt yourself because someone deliberately sticks his foot out to trip you as you walk by? Some hateful people will openly do this; some, in a sneaky way. Their aim is to provoke you to react with anger or fight-but if you do they can say: "I gotcha!" They and not you--have a support system that allows them to get away with dishonorable and evil deeds. However, if you report it, you will be blamed. If you decide to fight, you will be

stopped from reaching your goal. If you show anger, that indicates weakness to them and they will generate more and bigger problems for you. If you do nothing, you will become overly sensitive and distrust everybody-even the three of the ten Whites who are racially "Okay" (since both types are indistinguishable). Oversensitivity may mean losing compassion and even empathy for others-and it pushes even nice people away. My approach was not to react; to let them be; and to "do my thing" while out-working and out-smarting them. For what was not important I would "Buy my Peace"; for what was important, I "elbowed my way in."

### Black men expect amnesty for slandering Black women

misogyny and everyday conversation. D. L. Hughley jokingly lifted his tiny

finger in the defense of the Rutger basketball women on the Tonight Show after Don Imus called them nappyheaded ho's by saying that they were not ho's ... but they were nappy-headed and ugly. Later, in response to the backlash, Hughley hosted his own HBO special called Unapologetic. Hughley has given all types of rationalizations not to apologize. Frankly, Hughley and Thomas are probably good fathers to their biological children but lack empathy to the millions of Black single mothers that are without good husbands to help them build good self-esteem in their children, especially daughters. The thing these celebrity husbands and fathers do not consider is that through their celebrity they are a great part of the village that is raising the children, and unfortunately, they are the most influential male figurers in the village.

What is done with words is merely the verbal end of a continuum of abuse that too often ends with beatings and homicide as befalls many Black women at the hands of Black men daily. Black relationships and families fail at high rates because women increasingly refuse to put up with this abuse. The resulting absence of fathers - some 70 percent of Black babies are born to single mothers - is undoubtedly a major cause of youth delinquency.

The responsibility of roles model is to beware that very many people going for leadership are modeling their lives after them. With the dismal statistics as it relates to Blacks for the past 30 years, it is hard to argue that Black celebrity figurers do not lead Blacks astray.

Just today while grocery shopping in Albertson's Supermarket in Moreno Valley, I saw a young Black woman wearing a T-shirt on with the words 'Lucky B--ch' embroidered

across the front, and tattoos up and down both of her arms. She yanked and shook a 5 or 6-year-old boy by the ear as she yelled at him for playing with toys in the store. The boy cried though he seemed familiar with the routine. Customers watched in silent helplessness. I thought, if this boy's mother can so blatantly label herself the 'B' word, there's very little chance that her son

would grow up to respect Black women. Surely this young woman, who grew up in the hip-hop generation, has granted amnesty, as Isaiah Thomas suggested, to negative Black male voices of the world, has subconsciously adopted the message of her psychological oppressors and consequently feels she is not worthy to be viewed as dignified.



Everything from the turkey to the cranberry sauce is homemade and filled with love and a hope for better days ahead," said Powell.

What started with feeding children and now people who've lost their homes to foreclosure also includes the chronically homeless at local outreach shelters.

Thirteen years ago we were asked to make something special for children at the Boys and Girls Club. "Now it's a tradition," says Ellison. "The dinners don't cost that much. We think we've made a small difference in the world," said Powell.

"It's getting harder to find people who get a big kick out of making other people feel happy," said Ellison laughing.

One needn't look much further than the wide grin on Annie Powell and Ruby Ellison's faces.







On Sunday, November 18, 2007 the excellence continued and what a show it was.





ny, No Limit Films, and from my training with that company, was able to establish Codeblack Entertainment."



### Starting A Non-**Profit Tax-Exempt** Corporation

A popular misconception among many people who want to create a tax-exempt corporation is that they want to use this type of corporation to get grants and earn money for themselves without paying taxes. In reality, the actual owner of a tax-exempt non-profit corporation is the board of directors. The government uses the board of directors as a watchdog over the corporation. As the true legal owners of the corporation, the board of directors are held personally responsible for the correct operation of the corporation, even though the board of directors are all volunteers and may only meet once per year.

The creation of a tax-exempt non-profit organization is based upon an important exchange between the government and the corporation. The trade is that the government will allow a corporation to operate without the payment of income tax in exchange for the corporation donating all of its assets to charity and for using all of the corporation's resources for the benefit of the general public, instead of for the private benefit of a few key individuals.

A non-profit corporation and a tax-exempt corporation are not exactly the same entity. These two terms signify the two major applications filed in this process. The first step in the creation of any corporation is to state an intention to operate the corporation either as a for-profit or nonprofit corporations. The Articles of Incorporation is the document used for this purpose and it is filed with the California Secretary of State. Once the Articles of Incorporation is approved, the corporation is officially formed and can begin operations.

The second step is that a nonprofit corporation must file an application with the California Franchise Tax Board and with the Internal Revenue Service to request that their newly-formed non-profit corporation become exempt from federal and state income taxation.

The result of these two applications is the creation of a taxexempt non-profit corporation that is completely owned and controlled by the board of directors. It is very common that a single individual will initiate and pursue this two-step application process. To become a for-profit corporation, a single individual can own operate and control everything. However, to become a tax-exempt, non-profit corporation, the founder of an organization must agree to relinquish ownership of everything that the organization owns and also agree, via a declaration in the Articles of Incorporation, that none of the assets of the organization will be used for the private personal benefit of any individual, including the founder.

The IRS and the Franchise Tax Board has the power to revoke the tax-exempt status of any organization for violation of this basic requirement. Revocation will also mean that all donations previously received by the organization will not be tax deductible by the individuals who made those donations. Revocation may also result in personal liability to the board of directors for failing to properly supervise the actions of their corporation.



His first loan, to a poor Jobra woman consists of \$27.00 dollars from his own pocket. Then he made 42 more \$27.00 loans to women in the village. This act of kindness spearheaded the creation of an institution to lend to those women who had nothing. The results of his efforts are revolutionary, translating a vision into practical action toward the empowerment of poor women. Along with being awarded the 2006 Nobel Peace Prize, Dr. Yumus has been awarded 26 honorary doctorate degrees from around the world. To date over the last two decades Grameen Bank has loaned out over 6.5 million dollars to the poorest of the poor while maintaining according to news reports a repayment rate consistently about 98%. Dr. Yumus stated, "The average loan is \$150.00 dollars. He continued, "Money going to poor women brings much more benefits to their families. 

A group of men and women congregated at the home of Deacon and Deaconess David Jones with the intent of starting a church in the Good Hope Area. Deacon David Jones contacted the Rev. M.T. Williams from Oceanside, California and they all met on the first Sunday in November

of 1958 and was organized Good Hope Missionary Baptist Church.

The church met in the home of Deacon and Sister Henry Williams Sr. After which, the church rented a house on Mountain Avenue and remained at that location until the new church property was purchased. The ground breaking officials consisted of Rev. M.T. Williams, Rev. Eddington, Rev. B.A. Williams, Rev. Douglass and the entire Good Hope family.

The Sunday School was organized by brother Sonnie Ray Stafford who was the first Superintendent and sister Hazel Stafford was the first Sunday School Secretary. During the first fourteen years there were three ministers licensed, and one ordained. Seven Deacons were ordained and the church had four different clerks.

Rev. M.T.

Williams resigned due to bad health and asked the church to consider his son in the ministry, Rev. Clarence Fisher as the new Pastor. Rev. Fisher served
