

Problem Recognition

Postpartum Depression (PPD) occurs at a rate of 70% for mothers of infants in NICU

- AWHONN & American Academy of Pediatrics endorsed the key role of the NICU nurse in identifying signs & symptoms
- PPD the most common mental health complication in childbirth
- 1 in 10 Fathers experience PPD prior or after the birth of their child
