

RESIDENT PRODUCTION STAFF

John Garrity (Director) has been a member of the Providence College Faculty since 1976. He was the Managing Director of Theatre for many years and in that capacity was instrumental in the development and design of the Smith Center for the Arts which opened in 2004. Mr. Garrity has worked at the Olney Theatre Center in Maryland, Off Broadway at the MCC theatre in New York, The Rhode Island Playwright's Theatre and has directed over 40 plays at Providence College. He is the recipient of the Providence College Alumni Association award for exemplary service in administration. In 2006 the Masterpool Foundation established a theatre scholarship fund at Providence College in Mr. Garrity's name.

Thomas Edwards (Playwright) is among the current senior class of 2020 here at Providence College, and has been a theatre double major his entire four years. He has been working on *Beasts* since the idea first came into his mind all the way back in 2014 when he was only a sophomore in high school. These past six years, he has rewritten, edited, expanded and shrunk *Beasts* into what it is today. Thomas is extremely grateful to have been given the opportunity to workshop his first-ever produced show with the wonderful direction of John Garrity and the community of Providence College Theatre. Theatre tells us stories about people, and through these people we can have a conversation about what they are doing and why they do it, what the societal impacts and implications are, and where do we go from here; because we recognize a bit of ourselves and our society in these people, and if we can talk about what they do, we can talk about what we do too.

Tim Brown (Sound Designer) is thrilled to be a part of the first production of *Beasts*. Hailing from Melrose, Massachusetts, Tim is a senior at Providence College, where he studies both Theatre and Psychology. Tim spends his time at PC both acting onstage and working behind the scenes. His recent stage credits include *The Laramie Project*, Hamlet in *Hamlet*, and Jack Merridew in *Lord of the Flies*. Additionally, Tim has found a passion in the world of sound design. He has sound mixed various musicals here at Providence, including *Into the Woods*, *Bat Boy*, and the regional college premiere of *Something Rotten!*, as well as sound designed *Moon Over Buffalo* last spring. This summer, Tim will serve as a stage manager at White Heron Theatre Company on Nantucket.

Megan Chang (Vocal Coach) Megan is Assistant Professor of Voice & Speech at Providence College and the Core Curriculum Faculty Fellow for Oral Communication. Previously, she served as vocal coach for Something Rotten! (Regional Premiere), Moon Over Buffalo, Lord of the Flies, Hamlet, The Laramie Project, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Playhouse Creatures, and The Addams Family at Providence College. She also teaches a variety of workshops on campus and with local professionals, most recently working as a Communications Consultant for Brown University's EMSTL program. She also teaches workshops in conjunction with Breakthrough Providence and PC's Friar Foundation. She received her MFA in Vocal Pedagogy from Virginia Commonwealth University.

Previous coaching credits include: The 39 Steps, A Christmas Carol, Dial M for Murder (Triad Stage, North Carolina); The Winter's Tale, Serjeant Musgrave's Dance, Deadly Sins: A Sword Play, Hoodoo Love, The Blood Knot, Rodgers & Hammerstein's Oklahoma! (University of North Carolina School of the Arts); Cabaret, Dracula, Psycho Beach Party (Virginia Commonwealth University).

Trevor Elliott (Scenic & Lighting Designer) Trevor Elliott joined the production staff of PC in the spring of 2017. Before that, he was a freelance set designer/builder for local theaters including 2nd Story Theatre in Warren and New Bedford Festival Theatre at the Zeiterion. Trevor was the technical director at Roger Williams University from 2004 to 2011. Trevor is a graduate from Rhode Island School of Design with a degree in illustration. Previous designs at PC include *Bat Boy, Hamlet, Into the Woods, Playhouse Creatures*, and *The Addams Family*.

Maxine Wheelock (Costume Designer) Since 2006 Maxine has been the Costume Shop Supervisor in the department of Theatre, Dance and Film at Providence College. In that time she has built and/or coordinated costumes for all theatre and dance productions, working with many different designers and choreographers. Prior to coming to PC she served as principal dressmaker at Foothills Theatre and costume designer at the Forum Theatre, both regional theatres in Worcester, Massachusetts. She was principal dressmaker for Wood & Poplyk, whose design work for Showboat, aired on the PBS series "Great Performances," and was nominated for an Emmy. In recent years, she has enjoyed designing productions for Providence College, including Our Town (fall 2016), Hamlet (January 2018) and Bat Boy: The Musical (fall 2018). Her work on Bat Boy: The Musical earned a Motif Award nomination. In spring, 2017, she co-designed and built costumes for the premier production of Snow White for Providence Ballet Theatre. This past summer she worked as cutter/draper in Pompano Beach, FL at Costume World, the country's largest theatrical rental house.


