Dear Dr. Silver:

It is amazing how often I run across Mississippi as I study Michigan history. Once again I have run across a connection that intrigues me and I am wondering if perhaps you can help me with it. I am to give a paper at the Michigan Academy of Science and Arts in March and since I can't get away from my love for the South and the Civil War I chose as my topic "The Confederate Attempt to Capture Johnson's Island in Sandusky Bay, Ohio, September 19, 1864." Jacob Thompson, Confederate Commissioner in Canada, helped plan the raid. Since Thompson was from Oxford, Mississippi, I am wondering if you can tell me if there are any Thompson Papers located anywhere in the state. I have written Mr. McCain at the State Archives but haven't heard from him yet.

I wonder if any any chance he has any relatives still living in Oxford that would have any information. I realize that this is a rather nebulous hope but if you can give me any leads at all, I will appreciate it.
