Dear Dr. Silver:

We are grateful indeed for your interest in our orientation program for foreign employees of the Agency and for your willingness to serve as sponsor to them when they visit Mississippi.

I am enclosing a description of the program outlined for you by Jane Hockett in her telephone conversation with you. Enclosed, also, are biographic data sheets and photographs of Mr. Edison Teran and Mr. Florencio Bosio.

Mr. Teran is scheduled to arrive in Batesville at 6:25 p.m. via Illinois Central on March 18 and to remain through March 21. Mr. Bosio will be arriving in Batesville on March 20.
