REDISTRIBUTION OF NEGROES

This chart tells of the migration of negroes from South to North. Mississippi has been second in the nation, (Georgia first) every census period until 1950, when the Magnolia State went to third place, and now in the 1960 census dropped to 8th place. In rate of gain in negro population in the 10-year period, we are now 49th, with a net loss in ten years, of 70, 751. Actually, figuring in the excess of births over deaths, Mississippi lost a quarter-million negroes in the 1950-60 era. These 250,000 emissaries will do more to promote the cause of racial separation among white Yankees than all the written logic on earth.
