Letter from H. F. Belber (Frank) to Martha Alice Stewart, 15 April 1926

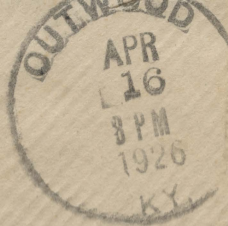
