ever spoken to good by.

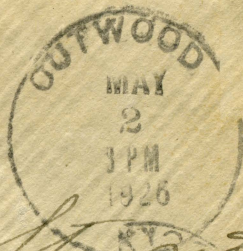
Tell you when are you
