I am grateful for your vote in support of my May 8th peace proposal as embodied in Senator George Aiken's amendment yesterday and for your vote against the fund cutoff proposal that finally passed the Senate. I cannot emphasize too strongly how important is the need for national unity during a period of negotiations toward a peaceful solution to the war.
