Now that we have finally achieved peace with honor in Vietnam, I particularly want you to know how much I have appreciated the support you have given during these difficult years to the policies that made that achievement possible. I know how great the pressures have been. I know the sort of attacks to which you have been subjected, as a result of following your conscience.
