Ancient bar in Connelly's Tavern on Ellicott Hill, built prior to 1795 when Spain ruled the Natchez territory. This bar was obtained from an abandoned gambling house in the notorious Natchez-Under-The Hill which, in the heyday of the Steamboat Era, was the most famous underworld haunt on the Mississippi River.
