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


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CONNELLY'S TAVERN ON ELLICOTT HILL NATCHEZ, MISS.

OPEN TO VISITORS DURING ANNUAL PILGRIMAGE THE LATTER PART OF MARCH

Cozy bedroom in Connelly's Tavern on Ellicott Hill, built prior to 1795 when Spain ruled the Natchez territory. According to tradition occupied by Harmon Blennerhassett in 1807 when he came to Natchez to meet Aaron Burr. Tavern Rules: Four pence a night for bed, Six pence with supper; No more than four to sleep in one bed; No boots to be worn in bed; Organ grinders to sleep in the washhouse; No dogs allowed up stairs; No beer allowed in the kitchen; No razor-grinders or Tinkers taken.
