able terms as we could expect. I shall
get Mr. Mollan to attend to our business
here, he will be a kind of guardian
for us. We have had such unfavour-
able accounts of Charleston & Columbia
and even all the Southern Country that I
have been afraid to think of leaving
here until the accounts are more
favourable, I think however that
I shall take a packet for Norfolk
and then take the stage for home in a few
