Rahway July 25<sup>th</sup> 1824

Mr. J. L. Treadwell

Dear Sir, I arrived here yesterday morning about 4 o'clock, and went to bed and slept until near twelve o'clock at noon. I did not then see you & quit & Ross until the afternoon. I made known my intentions, and laid before them my proposition but they would not agree to act until they had thought upon it, so they have until tomorrow to make up their minds, they are quite disappointed at my desiring a disputation and asked me if I would continue if they would allow me half the profits. I told them no that I had entered into an engagement with you and that I would rise or fall with you. What do you think? just before we parted last night they asked me if I would not take my part of the profits in outstanding debts, I told them no. I will write you again after we have another meeting.
