Dear Son,

Enclosed I hand
you a check drawn by the Planters Bank
of Tennessee on the Phenix Bank of N. York
for 200⁰⁰ which cost me two per cent which you can
sell to some of the merchants of N. H. or Raleigh
for the same you will please acknowledge
the receipt of the same as soon as it may come
to hand as I will feel some anxiety to hear
whether it arrived safe or not. H

We are all
enjoying fine health, Allison has not got
entirely well yet but is up and about,
Allison & Rebecca named their little girl
Ellas. I dont believe they have decided what
else they shall put to it. it is as fat
as a pig. I will make a pretty fine
crop this year if I can only save it
all I will make 75 or 80 Bales of Cotton
and lots of Corn.

Robert is overseeing
for me and I expect will do so next year,
his as fat & passy as you please and is nearly
as large as Allison. Mary Amelia Keitt &

Frank are all going to school and
I reckon learning fine; Frank can read
and spell very well. Arthura is left alone to
pass off the weeks and years in loneliness;

George Carruth returns home from
North Carolina Sunday before last and is talking
of starting to California about the first of December
which time Guss Reinhardt, John Pickens
(Carruths cousin) and Sidney Ramsour expect
to start for the Gold Region with rejoicing
hearts of the anticipation of the future but I
am afraid they will be somewhat deceived.

I am somewhat hurried or I would
give you a longer Epistle but I expect
you are so busy looking at the clock that
you will hardly take time to read what I have
already written, nothing more.
