Know All Men by these presents that I
James S. Mason, President of the Board of Select-
men of the Town of Port Gibson County of Claiborn
and State of Mississippi, have this day granted bar-
gained and sold and by these presents do grant
bargain and sell unto William M. W. Russell of
said Town and County, his heirs and assigns
all the right title Claim and interest, vested
in me by virtue of my Office as President as aforesaid
of in and to, Square number thirty nine, in the
Port Gibson grave yard, so have and to hold the
same to him and his heirs forever - for the sum
of Twenty Dollars by said Russell paid in hand
before the signing and sealing of these prese-
nts the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged.
