Sir:

In addition to the nominations I have already made, I respectfully ask, that the following appointments may be made upon my Staff, under the late act of Congress, known as the Staff bill.

For Ordnance officer I nominate Capt William T. Worthington, now on conscript duty in Mississippi. Capt W. has been in the service of the Confederate States since April 1861. He is a meritorious & worthy officer.

For Aid to Camp, A. C. Parlier for reappointment. Lt Parlier was appointed my Aid to Camp in July 1862, & has acted in that capacity until the present time.

William J. Sykes of the 43rd Miss Regt, is recommended for the other. He entered the service in 1861 & has continued in it until the present time. He is a worthy & meritorious young officer.
