Letter from Thomas C. Williams to General Featherston. 26 March 1870

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Holly Springs Sept 5th 1869

my dear Daught

I wrote you Saturday morning giving you the Condition of Genl F. I would have written you yesterday but the mails are not sent from this office on Sundays.

Genl F is well, Gholson did not give him quinine & he was comfortable that day, yesterday he did not give any & he was comfortable to day (Monday) ~~he~~^{he} is still doing well, sitting up - Gholson kept him sick 4 days with the quinine he would commence taking it at 5 in the morning & continue each day till 9 or 10 Ock & would suffer greatly with his head which would continue till night - at night he rested well at least the greater part of the night - The doctor no doubt has pursued a very judicious course in the treatment of his case - preventing a severe spell of Billious fever - and the remedy, tho a severe one, in his case is not so bad as the disease - I now consider him well and with care out of danger of being sick - The little boys are wonderful, full of all mischief & good humor, they keep everything

going in the House & out of it - tell Sister Mary
If I had 4 boys I would give her one, my love
to her & the dear little ones - & Mr Mr Cloyd -
nothing new of interest - I have not time to
write you a letter - your ma very well -
