JONES—Died, at Spuyten-Duyvel, near New York City, on Saturday morning, August 10th, Hattie Haven, daughter of Edward L. and Charlotte G. Jones. Her remains will be conveyed to Milwaukee, to be placed beside those of a beloved sister.—From Atlanta Constitution, August 12th, 1872.

A GENTLE SPIRIT FLED.—Many will be pained to notice the death of Miss Hattie H. Jones, who has for so long a time been an invalid and a great sufferer,

Her mother and younger brother were with her, and the telegram to her father Mr. E. L. Jones, reads, that "she passed quietly away at four o'clock this (Saturday) morning." The hope that a change of air and scene might benefit her, was not to be realized, and she has gone to that better Home, for which all who knew her believe she was abundantly prepared.—From Atlanta Constitution, August 12, 1872.
