February 5th 1861

Dear Mother

I received your letter
some time ago but have
not had time to

answer it until now

I must say that I
was surprised at its
tenor " you spoke

of me paying you

rent also spoke of
not letting me have

the land &c. I am

willing as I have

always been to pay
you all I owe for

rent or any thing else
as to the land I
thought that we had
agreed on the price
including your furniture
&c I only thought
that it was too much
after you had removed
the most of it therefore
said no more about
it - I am willing
to pay the value for
what is remaining on
the land alone - you
can give the furniture
to whoever you
please

If you will let me
know when you will
come down I will
send for you at
German town & we will
leave it to disinterested
persons to say how
much I owe you
for rent &c I would
like to get the land
as I have bought land
adjoining & have
improved & cleared
a great deal. I will
give as much as
any body else for
it Love to all
