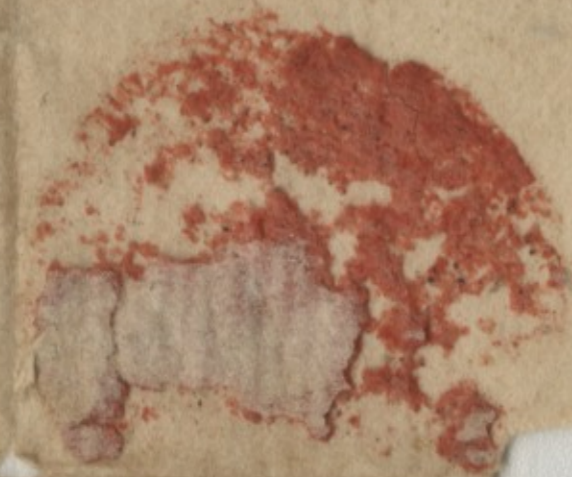

Dear William

Wrote 13th February 1814

The enclosed papers was handed me last night late by Mr Harding, with a particular injunction that you should have them this day, thus I found myself able to do, & presuming you could not suffer much from any advantage that could be taken in the manner of the testimony tomorrow (as you attorney J. G. Clarke lives in Gervon post) I concluded to send to that place by mail in the surest mode, as well as most expeditious of conveyance. Harding urges much the great ~~importance of procuring the testimony~~ he has pointed out, to which yourself a attorney will no doubt attend. The copy of the bill he wishes sent again down for the Government of Thompson when he shall take testimony, as the importance of the cause in every way is to you great. I think no excusess should be wanting as I find on reading the bill your reputation as well as property is at stake, & both will suffer if proof shall not be produced to substantiate all your papers.
