OXFORD, Miss., Sept. 30.— Long lines of worshipers filed into the churches at Oxford Sunday, while military planes flew overhead and an encampment soldiers set up camp northeast of the city.

All of the churches had overflow crowds and in some the congregation was twice as many as the previous Sunday. Only one church pastor said his attendance was down from the previous week. He attributed the decline to
