

It seems to confirm the many statements I have been making on the subject.

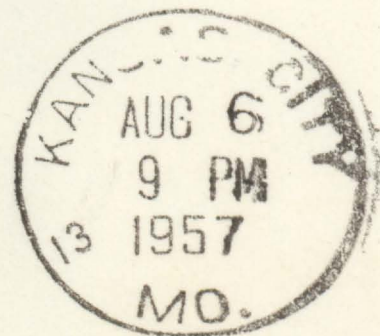
