Hon. C. S. Thomas
Dear Sir

I am highly pleased to see in the missive that marked distinction conferred and high respect awarded to our worthy Representative in the choice of yourself as Chairman to organize the House of Representatives in the State Legislature (knowing that it was not done of your own liking) such an act is and will continue to be a source of gratification to your friends and neighbors. By such elevation we feel our selves much honored and highly complimented as your Constituents. Believing at the same time that we are entitled to such favor in consequence of high qualifications and merits.

There is not at this time any political questions agitating either State or National policy that did not exist when you left here.

The sentiment relating to our servants making some effort for their freedom has entirely subsided in this neighborhood.

So far as the Gov's message relates to National policy I believe it meets the entire approbation of the citizens on this part of the

Country. The Confidence reposed and expressed in
your lab. election is undiminished so far as I
can Judge, and I do most sincerely hope that
you may be able to meet all ~~the~~ questions
~~or may~~ ~~occasionally~~ brought before you that
may come before you, with such marked ability
and at the same time with such moderation and
Respect towards our political enemies (the persons
friends) as will give general Satisfaction
to the party to which you belong, and as
little offence as possible to your political opponents
with an eye single to the best Interest of the
State at large and in particular to that
Interest of Manabai County -

Since you left here the trustees of Tarnor
and vicinity have held a meeting for the purpose
of taking into Consideration the propriety of establishing
on permanent basis a Female Academy in this
place. The meeting appointed a Committee
to examine the various Locations, and report the
most favourable one, which they do -

The meeting then appointed Dr G. W. Smith
the Rev. S. Murray, Lane Washaw, May P. Puckett
and myself Trustees for the Academy -

The Trustees appointed Dr G. W. Smith
and the Rev. S. Murray a Corresponding Committee
to ascertain as early as possible who can or could
be obtained to take charge of the Academy with
the necessary qualifications

Which qualifications are to be of the first order
including music!

Should you know of any such
Lady I am requested to ask the favour of you
to advise the Corresponding Committee of this place
as early as possible

The Lady to be employed to take
charge of a Reading must possess all the
qualifications necessary and be capable of
teaching all the various branches of education
usually taught in Female Academies of the
highest order including music

Please present my respects to
Mr R. Barton, Mr G. Scott, Mr Nelson and
the Hon. A. M. Clayton. I saw Arthur
