Bristol Station Oct 28<sup>th</sup>

My dear Aunt Sue.

I went out to Greenwood Hospital this evening, finding all of our sick ones walking about even Robert Deering he is much better than I was afraid of finding him. Dr Coak went with me, we were rather late in returning so I feel perfectly stunned and sleepy, and not the least fit like writing any thing worth 5 cents. Col. Moore has returned and went to Camp to-day with several of the regiment among them a Surgeon, by whom I sent the potatoes and apples. Mr. Seips was disappointed me about the honey, I wanted him, as it is so much since then Mr. Gaines and he promised to let me have it by this morning. I wrote a note with them. Dr. Baileys has returned from Warrington meeting with no success in the secret line no one being willing to hire me so near the Yankees. I will have to try and get the free boy yet. we will start in the morning for the camp. We hear nothing new. Centerville is perfectly quiet. Paunteme has not returned. Tell Davis that Dr. Coak has promised to bring his horse for him Wednesday & Thursday.





I can hear nothing of my bundle here. So will have to wait until I go to camp. I will write to you from there and maybe will have something to interest you. Until then goodbye. Much love to George and Eddie, & Mrs. M<sup>o</sup> Entsch & Kiley. Aunt Sue please see that Silvia is not idle. There was no bundle left here for me to-day - I have not sent to the P. O. yet. I came in so late.
