NEW YORK, April 25th 1868

My dear Mayor,

I have been reading here, federal accounts of our last operations. It is stated in them, that Slocum, who commanded the troops we attacked on the 19th, took 338 prisoners. And Howard, who came up with the right wing next day, 1287. The total exceeds our report of shipping by about 1000. We had a ~~report~~ return made out on the 23^d. A statement of the number of men (of the A. I.) who joined between the 19th and 22^d inclusive, would enable me to show our whole loss. If you have any reports which would show the number, you will oblige me much by writing it to me.
