American February 11 1844

Kind Sir:

You will perceive that, in making my note for the amount of interest for the present year, I failed to deduct the amt of your account <sup>say</sup> \$891<sup>00</sup>. Eight hundred and ninety one dollar, which would have made the face of the note \$14,109<sup>00</sup> instead of \$18,000<sup>00</sup>. Will you please endorse the amount of your account <sup>\$891<sup>00</sup></sup> on the back of the note so that it may be collected.

Since I suggested the reestablishment of a Post office on the Bend to Mr Joseph Lovell, I am informed that he (Mr Lovell) & Mr Pitkin have drawn up a petition signed by some other white persons on that part of the Bend and endorsed by the P. M. at Natchez, to <sup>having</sup> the Office at the Bank; and recommend a Superintendent of Huntington & Pitkin as Post master. Capt Mitchell, the supervisor of Arsin's plantation professes to know but little about the matter and intimates that his name was affixed to the petition without his knowledge.

I heard from Mrs Quarson lately, all are reported well except Sam, who had been sick about 2 weeks but was at the time of her writing getting better.

She says she finds it difficult to make  
a living. I will write again soon.
