June 12th, 1885.

My Dear Son:

We have not heard from you for several days. How are you getting on in your studies? We are all well. We had splendid rains here, yesterday. Mrs. Clark's examination closed on Wednesday. Eliza, Mamie Clark & Miss Haas were tied in elocution, the committee was unable to decide between them. There were seven in the class. Eliza drew the gold medal. She did recite her piece very well, better than any one in the class. Tell cousin Sattie, that Judge Orr has answered my letter, it says he will vote for her to fill the chair of Elocution, in the University. I have not heard from Judge Clayton. Fannie McHenry has gone to Memphis for a few days. Write a short epistle, if you have time. Affectionately,
