San Francisco Dec 7<sup>th</sup> 1864

Dear Margery,

I have just now had  
time to write you a few lines, to let you  
know how we are getting on here we have  
just got thro our Election for Regimental  
officers & then we have a splendid list  
of officers Capt Duncan is our Major  
and in a few days we will have to elect  
a Captain, and I expect to give the boys  
a chance for that office I think from  
Morgan's indications that my chances are  
good to be Capt of the 10th Iowa  
I have had nothing of importance transpired  
in our Company since we left we are  
all well but Mr Phillips is very  
ill yesterday but took a dose of pills  
last night and is better to day, we  
have the fine opportunity and let you know  
if you are all well and if all is going  
right the waggons is just come to  
us to the Coche and I must close I will  
write again in a few days. Saw some  
fine the present kids the children all  
for you and let Sam kiss you for me
